ADMISSIONS INTERVIEWS: The time commitment is about four hours per interview session, and alumni may volunteer for as few as one session (a single half-day) to as many as 10 half-days per year. About six thirty-minute interviews are required on each interview day, and interviewers are required to enter computerized notes into our admissions system on the day they interview. Interviewers are also encouraged to stay and interact with the candidates during the hosted lunch if time allows.

MENTORING STUDENTS: The time commitment varies, but is likely about one hour per month of e-mailing and telephoning mentees from CPG.

H.O.M.E. PROGRAM: The Health Outreach through Medicine and Education (H.O.M.E.) program is an entirely student-run organization whose mission is to improve the health of homeless individuals in the greater Phoenix area while educating healthcare students about patient care and examinations. H.O.M.E. continues to rely on volunteer preceptors from the community. The H.O.M.E. program serves the community for three hours on a weeknight. Volunteer preceptors may participate as much as they would like.

SERVING ON COMMITTEES: There are several opportunities to serve in leadership roles and connect with fellow alumni on various committees such as the CPG Alumni Council, reunion planning, and the Bright Lights, Shining Stars Gala.

ACADEMIC/TEACHING OPPORTUNITIES: Several academic and teaching opportunities are available through CPG. If you are interested in applying for these positions, we can put you in touch with the appropriate person.

PRECEPTING: Serving as a preceptor is one of our biggest needs. You may remember your first days on rotation or even starting at a new practice site, eager to learn and contribute, but a little hesitant and unsure of yourself. Perhaps a past preceptor or mentor explained, demonstrated and inspired you to think for yourself and achieve. Today, you have the opportunity to be that person by giving back to the profession. Becoming a preceptor and mentor to a student is one of the most honored contributions you can make to the profession!
