ECONOMIC IMPACT

\$696.9 Million Overall Impact

Midwestern University is committed to educating healthcare professionals and is proud to be one of the region's significant economic engines. Recently, the University commissioned a comprehensive, independent analysis by Applied Economics, a specialized economics consulting firm, to determine its current and ongoing financial impact:



▪ **\$100.5 MILLION**

IN DIRECT PAYROLL AND 925 JOBS

The University provides quality, good-paying jobs to Arizona residents.

▪ **3,200 JOBS AND \$130.8 MILLION**

IN PAYROLL AT OTHER BUSINESSES

The local business community benefits from the economic engine of the University.

▪ **\$19.8 MILLION**

IN STATE AND LOCAL TAXES

Midwestern indirectly generates property, sales, and personal income tax revenues.

Through their spending, Midwestern students supported 2,000 jobs and created \$75.7 million in labor income at local businesses.

The University is an important purchaser of local supplies and services.

▪ **\$221.6 MILLION IN CONSTRUCTION SPENDING**

Midwestern will spend \$221.6 million in construction expenditures from 2019 to 2027. The construction activity will create an economic impact of approximately \$395.3 million in Maricopa County over the next nine years, along with supporting about 2,300 jobs and \$131.8 million in total labor income in the county.

Expanding Knowledge

At Midwestern University, research is considered a vital ingredient for excellent teaching. It is our goal, as a healthcare university, to not only disseminate knowledge, but to create new knowledge and to foster life-long learning in our students. To that end, the University supported research by awarding 44 student fellowships and 24 support positions at a total cost of \$1.97 million fiscal year 2019.
